Educational research confirms that reading is a core skill and that students who read usually excel in all areas of study. Trinity wants its students to prepare themselves for the upcoming school year and maintain their skills in reading, thinking, and vocabulary.

Students are asked to read the novel **Ground Zero: A Novel of 9/11** by New York Times bestselling author Alan Gratz (which can be ordered from Amazon). Students will need to complete the following activity to be turned in the first week of school:

 Read, Reflect, and Respond Journal—this needs to be completed in a COMPOSITION NOTEBOOK and should be done as the student reads the book (NOT after the book is complete). See instructions below...

## Read, Reflect, and Respond Journal

- 1. For EACH chapter of the novel, you must select ONE question to answer from UNDERSTANDING THE TEXT and MAKING INFERENCES.
- 2. AT THE END OF THE NOVEL, you must select ONE question to answer from MAKING CONNECTIONS, AUTHOR'S PURPOSE, AND EVALUATING THE BOOK.

This assignment must be completed in a COMPOSITION NOTEBOOK. Each chapter should be labeled correctly (see format below).
